From June 20th 2011, **An Endless Room** is inviting bands and musicians to use their intimate recording studio in Primrose Hill - a studio that is run by real music lovers, driven by a passion for music.

Led by a philosophy of **ORIGINALITY ABOVE ALL THINGS**, this is the perfect place to come and be wildly creative, supported by a beautiful collection of modern and vintage musical instruments and recording equipment. The studio is particularly suited to those writing and recording on the fly – an inspirational space for great ideas to take shape.

The studio is owned by **Ruby Slippers Records** – an independent record label looking to put out a few small-budget releases over the next few years for truly unique artists. If you're a band recording here they'll take a listen. If you're not recording here they'll still take a listen! Any money generated from the studio will go to funding the label.

There will also be some other rather interesting goings-on over the next few months – watch out for recorded sessions with various bands, interviews and other special features that bands will be able to take part in.

The studio has an interesting musical heritage having originally formed part of the legendary Utopia Studios in the 1970s and 1980s. During its golden age, people like Stevie Wonder, Tina Turner, Sting and Freddie Mercury all recorded here.

An Endless Room promises a huge and constantly growing collection of musical equipment - currently over 60 effects pedals, 30 guitars and amps, 10 pianos and synths, 20 vintage and modern microphones, a 70s Ludwig stainless steel drum kit, a Roland TR808 drum machine, Roland RE201 Space Echo and a fog machine.

...Plus loads more.

The location is amazing too – just a ten minute walk from Chalk Farm tube, Camden's Markets and the top of Primrose Hill itself - the perfect spot for a little inspiration boost. The complex also has 24 hour manned security. Gates are locked to the public 11pm-7am.

Their 10-hour recording sessions include:

- A Producer / Engineer leading the process.
- Unlimited use of all our equipment please see full inventory overleaf.
- A snack basket including sandwiches, crisps, chocolates and soft drinks.
- Tea and decent coffee.
- Free artist / band photography session with Fascination St* including one free photo.

They're also still working on some kind of recommend-a-friend scheme where you can get free recording sessions by recommending others.
